- Prevents bullying and school violence
- Increases personal accountability in children and youth
- Decreases behavioural problems and need for school discipline like suspensions and expulsions
- Transform school social and academic culture to one of connectedness, pride and engagement
- Reduces drop out rates
- Improves learning outcomes

Our project lead, Andrew Lynch, is a retired school principal who understands the value of RP to school communities. Our volunteers are highly trained, experienced with kids and from our local community.

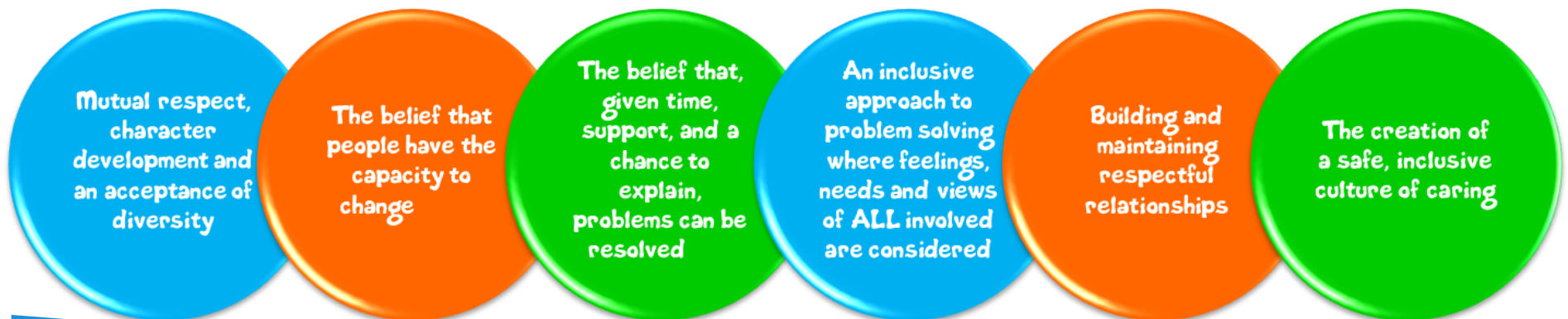
WHERE:
